Our Behaviour Blueprint

Last academic year, staff and governors spent a long time thinking about behaviour at Wantage CE and how we promote the very best behaviour and attitudes throughout the school. We believe that behaviour is very good at Wantage CE and visitors frequently comment on how polite children are and how calm and purposeful the learning is in classrooms.

Equally, there will always be times when children make mistakes. This is part of growing up and everyone needs to learn to manage their emotions as well to learn how to be kind, thoughtful and responsible.

We have written our behaviour expectations and how we help children to behave well at Wantage CE into a document that we have called our Behaviour Blueprint. I have included a copy of the Blueprint with this letter.

Our three behaviour expectations remain the same, and we always expect all children to be: Ready, Respectful and Safe.

Our approach to behaviour also remains the same. We take a positive approach to helping children to behave well which is best summarised as 'calm and consistent' adults. This is the approach that we have used for many years. Through clear routines and praising children for showing the behaviour we want to see, everyone learns to behave well.

The main difference is that we have taken away the old language of 'stages'. Having 'stages' was helpful when they were first introduced, however over time they had become less helpful, and we have replaced them with what we believe is a much better approach.

When you read the Blueprint, you will see that consequences are still there because it is important for children to learn that if they make a wrong choice, there is a consequence to those choices. Equally, we have included time for children to manage their emotions (what we call 'regulate') if they are struggling to manage their behaviour. We are also placing a greater emphasis on using restorative conversations to help children to talk about occasions when things might have gone wrong and to learn from those situations in a constructive way.

A couple of reminders

Please could I bring to your attention to these reminders which are important to help keep everyone safe and happy at Wantage CE:

1. Children should not bring in footballs from home. Please remind your son or daughter that the only balls we allow are ones provided by school. This is because the footballs we use at play times are softer than match-ready balls to avoid non-football players being injured by flying heavy footballs.

2. Bicycles and Scooters should not be ridden in the playground or on the paths leading into/out of school. We have had a number of near-misses where children have been enthusiastically cycling/scooting and have nearly collided with families – particularly on the path from the playground past the cemetery.

3. Parents must not use the school carpark after 7:30am. It is dangerous for staff arriving in the morning as well as for children and families walking to breakfast club if parents are driving out of the gates after 7:30am. Thank you for your cooperation with this important rule.
